

# COMMUNITY COLLEGE RESOURCE GUIDE FOR ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG (AOD) EDUCATION AND PREVENTION

Virginia's community colleges face unique challenges in the education and prevention of substance misuse due to their structure, availability of resources and diverse population of non-residential students.

**Substance misuse can lead to poor academic performance in addition to decreased retention and graduation rates.**

This information sheet provides resources that can be helpful in addressing substance misuse and linking students to supportive community partners.

## HOW DOES SUBSTANCE MISUSE IMPACT ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE?<sup>1</sup>

Substance misuse during college can lead to a domino effect of academic consequences.

### 1 ■ INTERMEDIARY PROCESSES

- Skipping class
- Studying less
- Decreasing motivation
- Poor quality/less sleep
- Cognitive problems

### 2 ■ SHORT-TERM MANIFESTATIONS

- Declining GPA
- Dropping classes
- Lost opportunities (internships, work, special studies)

### 3 ■ LONG-TERM OUTCOMES

- Delayed graduation
- Failure to graduate
- Attenuation of goals
- Lack of readiness for employment
- Underemployment



► Binge drinking is defined as when a female consumes 4 or more drinks and a male consumes 5 or more drinks in a short period of time. Binge drinking can lead to alcohol poisoning and other negative health outcomes.

► In a study, both marijuana and illicit drug use were significantly related to higher chances of discontinuous enrollment.<sup>1</sup>

# REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE **DRUG-FREE SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITIES ACT**

Under the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act's (**DFSCA**), Drug-Free Schools and Campuses Regulations (**EDGAR Part 86**), institutions of higher education (**IHEs**) receiving federal funding or financial assistance must do the following:<sup>3</sup>



## **Annual Notification**

IHEs must notify all students and employees annually of the following:

1. Standards of conduct
2. Possible legal sanctions and penalties
3. Statements of the health risks associated with AOD abuse
4. The IHE's AOD programs available to students, staff, and faculty
5. Disciplinary sanctions for violations of the standards of conduct

IHEs must make the notification in writing and in a manner that ensures all students and employees receive it.



## **Implement an AOD Program**

IHEs must develop and implement a program to prevent the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol by students and employees.



## **Biennial Review**

Every two years an IHE must conduct a review of its AOD program to determine effectiveness and the consistency of sanction enforcement, in order to identify and implement any necessary changes. The U.S. Department of Education recommends that IHEs conduct the biennial review in even-numbered years and focus their report on the two preceding academic years.

## **WHAT CAN YOU DO ON YOUR CAMPUS?**

- ▶ Provide educational trainings to students that reduces substance misuse and related harm. Incorporating a session into your SDV classes or requiring students to take an online evidence-based education program are two examples. Our HEADS UP program provides free training materials on our website.
- ▶ Disseminate a survey to collect the beliefs, behaviors and attitudes of your students. This can help to more effectively determine the specific needs on your campus and strategically implement initiatives to address those identified needs. The Core Alcohol and Drug Survey ([www.core.siu.edu](http://www.core.siu.edu)) provides a specialized instrument for community colleges.
- ▶ Use the data you've collected to combat misperceptions that students may have about substance use within your campus/community through a social norms campaign.
- ▶ Be clear about your campuses substance use policies and consistently communicate and enforce those policies.
- ▶ Train faculty and staff to recognize when a student may have a substance use problem, how to briefly intervene and refer them to the right services within your community.
