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Executive Summary

As a commitment to transparency, accountability and reporting, the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority's Bureau of Law Enforcement produces this quarterly report in accordance with Virginia Code 4.1-103 #30 and as part of its implementation of the recommendations of the Governor's Expert Panel, created by Governor McAuliffe in Executive Order 40. The report demonstrates our adoption of the panel's recommendations as well as ensuring citizen access to information.

During the 2019 Virginia General Assembly session, legislation was enacted through the Virginia State Budget Item 4-5.04 m. "requiring no expenditures from general or non-general fund sources may be made by any state agency or authority for the purchase of implementation of body-worn camera systems". While the Governor's Expert Panel recommended the use of body-worn cameras by Virginia ABC special agents, the Authority halted the procurement and implementation process of body-worn cameras due to the current legal prohibition. If the prohibition is lifted, the Authority will assess at that time whether implementation of body worn cameras is practicable under existing policies and legal standards.

The Governor's Expert Panel gave clear directions on the content of this quarterly report. This report follows those basic guidelines. Listed below is a synopsis of the data reported in each of those areas:

- 1. **Criminal Violations** There were 51 total charges placed this quarter with 44 (86%) of those charges related to alcohol violations. Last quarter there were 118 charges with 108 (92%) being alcohol related. There is a 57% decrease in total arrests compared to last quarter. Racial breakdown of arrests shows the percentage of arrestees were 45% white and 37% black. Distribution of arrests by gender for the quarter shows 39% of arrestees being male and 61% female.
- 2. **Regulatory violations** This quarter saw a 31% decrease in violations brought to hearings and a 7% decrease in written warnings when compared to 4Q 2019. There was a 129% increase in regulatory charges adjudicated in hearings with 214 in 4Q 2019 and 490 in 1Q 2020.
- 3. **Field Contacts** There were no field contacts made this quarter.
- 4. **Planned Operations** There were no planned operation this quarter and one in the fourth quarter of 2019.
- 5. **Use of Force Reports** There was one Use of Force incidents this quarter involving one officer.
- 6. **Internal Investigations** There is currently one open Internal Investigation that is pending. There were no informal complaints assigned to the field.
- 7. **License Activity** Retail approvals showed a decrease of 12% for the first quarter of 2020 compared to the previous quarter. Retail license approvals are down roughly 9% when compared to the 1st quarter of 2019. Banquet license approvals show a 58% decrease when compared to the previous quarter and a 10% decrease when compared to the first quarter of 2019.
- 8. **Inspections/Observations** Inspections showed a decrease of 18% when comparing first quarter of 2020 to fourth quarter of 2019, and a 22% decrease when compared to the first quarter of 2019. Observations are up 6% when comparing first quarter 2020 to the previous quarter.
- 9. **Underage Buyer –** UAB alcohol checks showed a decrease of 59% this quarter when compared to the previous quarter. The compliance rate was 90%. Eight UAB tobacco checks were completed with a compliance rate of 63%.
- 10. **Training and Community Outreach** ABC presented over 528 hours of training to law enforcement, licensees and the general public this quarter. There were 1215 hours of training received by ABC agents. These agents also attended over 937 hours of community outreach meetings.
- 11. **Accreditation** Re-accreditation for VA ABC was accomplished on January 9th 2020. A 2nd reaccreditation Term began on November 1, 2019 and will end on October 31st, 2023. All 190 standards have completed or in progress proofs for the quarter.

A majority of the arrests (44) involve sales made to underage individuals. These arrests usually occur as a result of the ABC underage buyer compliance program.

These violations can be punishable by fines, suspension or revocation of the ABC license.

Field Contacts

A field contact is when an agent engages a citizen and conducts a brief interview. When an arrest does not occur as a result of a field interview, agents report the stop in a "Field Contact" report. This report documents the reason for the stop as well as identifying information about the individual. Scrutiny of these types of encounters enables law enforcement executives as well as citizens to monitor police/citizen interactions to guard against biased-based policing practices.

License Activity Totals

A significant amount of an agent's time is committed to the approval process of both retail and "one day" banquet licenses. This process involves background investigations, venue/establishment inspections and training.

Retail License Approvals

Retail Application approvals, sometimes tied to economic conditions, decreased 12% for the first quarter of 2020 when compared to the previous quarter. In 1Q of 2019 there were 509 retail license approvals compared to 461 in 1Q of 2020 reflecting a 9% decrease in approvals.


Banquet Licenses Approvals

Banquet License approvals, which follow seasonal trends, decreased in the first quarter with a 58% decrease when compared to the previous quarter. In 1Q of 2019 there were 3771 banquet license approvals compared to 3389 in 1Q of 2020 reflecting a 10% decrease in activity compared to first quarter of last year.

Underage Buyer Totals

The Underage Buyer (UAB) program is an ongoing effort by Virginia ABC to visit alcohol and tobacco retailers throughout the Commonwealth to verify compliance with the state age requirements - 21 for tobacco and 21 for alcohol sales. Special Agents accompany underage operatives during attempts to purchase cigarettes or alcohol at grocery stores, convenience stores, restaurants and other businesses, including Virginia ABC stores.
