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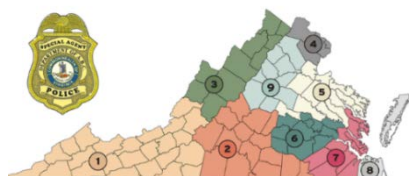
Executive Summary

The Governor's Expert Panel gave clear directions on the content of this quarterly report. This report follows those basic guidelines. Listed below is a synopsis of the data reported in each of those areas:

1. **Criminal Violations** – There was 1 charge placed this quarter with none (0%) charge related to alcohol violations. Last quarter there were 3 charges with one (33%) charge being alcohol related. Arrests are down 66% compared to last quarter. Racial breakdown of arrests shows the percentage of arrestees were 100% white. Distribution of arrests by gender for the quarter shows 100% of arrestees being female.
2. **Regulatory violations** – This quarter saw no changes in violations brought to hearings and a 7% decrease in written warnings when compared to 4Q 2020. There was a 14% decrease in regulatory charges adjudicated in hearings with 66 in 4Q 2020 and 57 in 1Q 2021.
3. **Field Contacts** – There were no field contacts made this quarter.
4. **Planned Operations** – There was one planned operation this quarter and none in the fourth quarter of 2020.
5. **Use of Force Reports** – There were no reported Use of Force incidents this quarter.
6. **Internal Investigations** – There are currently two open Internal Investigation. There were no informal complaints assigned to the field.
7. **License Activity** – Retail approvals are down 7% for the first quarter of 2021 compared to the previous quarter. Retail license approvals show no change when compared to the 1st quarter of 2020. Banquet license approvals show an 89% decrease when compared to the previous quarter and an 89% decrease when compared to the first quarter of 2020.
8. **Inspections/Observations** – Inspections showed a decrease of 17% when comparing first quarter of 2021 to fourth quarter of 2020, and a 75% increase when compared to the first quarter of 2020. Observations are up 3% when comparing first quarter 2021 to the previous quarter.
9. **Underage Buyer** - No UAB alcohol checks or tobacco checks were completed this quarter.
10. **Training and Community Outreach** – ABC presented over 403 hours of training to law enforcement, licensees and the general public this quarter. There were 512 hours of training received by ABC agents. These agents also attended over 627 hours of community outreach meetings.
11. **Accreditation** – Re-accreditation for VA ABC was accomplished on January 9th, 2021. A 2nd reaccreditation Term began on November 1, 2019 and will end on January 31st, 2023. All 190 standards have completed or in progress proofs for the quarter.

These violations can be punishable by fines, suspension or revocation of the ABC license.

Field Contacts

A field contact is when an agent engages a citizen and conducts a brief interview. When an arrest does not occur as a result of a field interview, agents report the stop in a “Field Contact” report. This report documents the reason for the stop as well as identifying information about the individual. Scrutiny of these types of encounters enables law enforcement executives as well as citizens to monitor police/citizen interactions to guard against biased-based policing practices.

License Activity Totals

A significant amount of an agent's time is committed to the approval process of both retail and "one day" banquet licenses. This process involves background investigations, venue/establishment inspections and training.

Retail License Approvals

Retail Application approvals, sometimes tied to economic conditions, decreased 7.3% for the first quarter of 2021 when compared to the previous quarter. In 1Q of 2020 there were 461 retail license approvals compared to 466 in 1Q of 2021 reflecting a 1% increase in approvals.

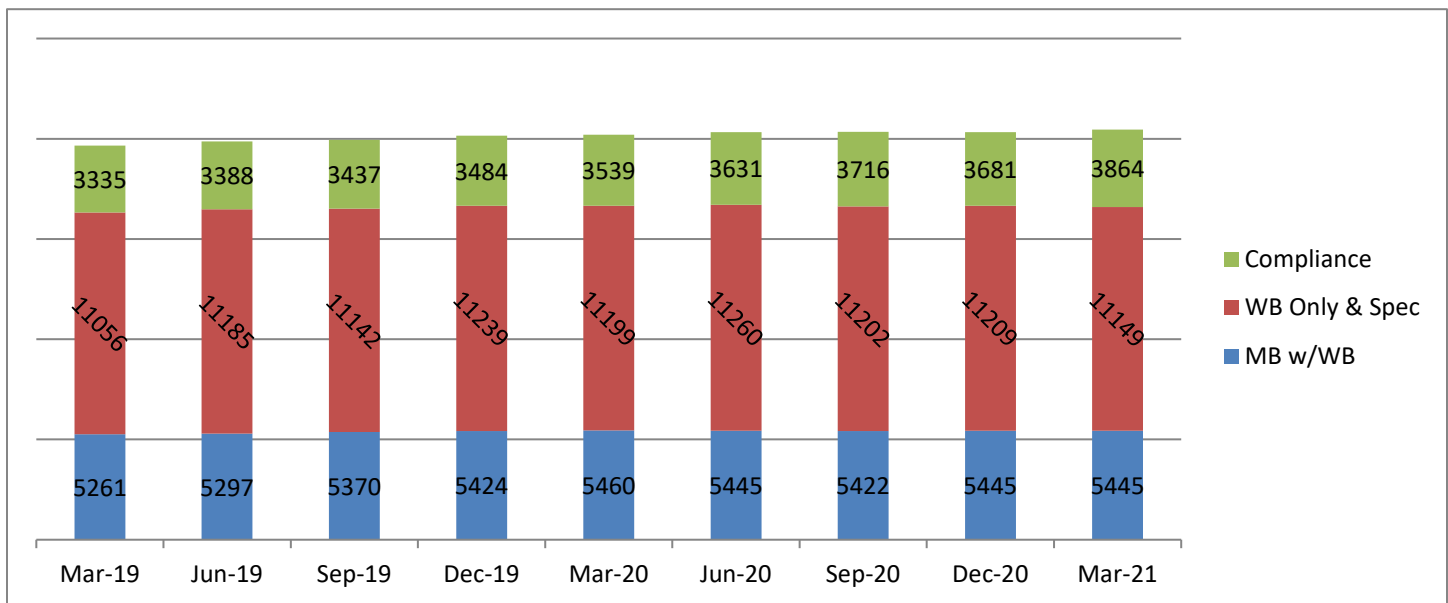
Banquet Licenses Approvals

Banquet License approvals, which follow seasonal trends, decreased 89% in the first quarter when compared to the previous quarter. In 1Q of 2020 there were 3389 banquet license approvals compared to 358 in 1Q of 2021 reflecting a 89% decrease in activity compared to second quarter of last year.

Licensee Inspections Completed

All ABC licensed establishments are subject to inspection by ABC agents. These inspections are overt; the agent will inspect the premises for compliance with regulatory requirements, meet with the owner or manager to review business receipts and purchasing records, review previously submitted MBARs and answer any questions business employees may have about ABC laws and requirements.

Observations Completed

Agents also conduct unannounced, covert, plain-clothes observations of ABC establishments to ensure licensees are following all ABC laws and regulations. Many of these observations are follow-up investigations initiated by citizen complaints.
