3rd Quarter - 2021 July 1st through September 30th

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Executive Summary

The Governor's Expert Panel gave clear directions on the content of this quarterly report. This report follows those basic guidelines. Listed below is a synopsis of the data reported in each of those areas:

- 1. **Criminal Violations** There were no charges placed this quarter with no (0%) charges related to alcohol violations. Last quarter there was 1 charge with no (0%) charges being alcohol related. Arrests are down 100% compared to last quarter.
- 2. **Regulatory violations** This quarter saw a 2% increase in violations brought to hearings and a 35% decrease in written warnings when compared to 2Q 2021. There was a 19% decrease in regulatory charges adjudicated in hearings with 73 in 2Q 2021 and 59 in 3Q 2021.
- 3. **Field Contacts** There were no field contacts made this quarter.
- 4. **Planned Operations** There were 9 planned operations this quarter and five in the second quarter of 2021.
- 5. **Use of Force Reports** There were no reported Use of Force incidents this quarter.
- 6. **Internal Investigations** There is currently one open Internal Investigation. There were no informal complaints assigned to the field.
- 7. **License Activity** Retail approvals are up 14% for the third quarter of 2021 compared to the previous quarter. Retail license approvals are up 3% when compared to the 3rd quarter of 2021. Banquet license approvals show a 61% increase when compared to the previous quarter and a 26% increase when compared to the third quarter of 2020.
- 8. **Inspections/Observations** Inspections showed a increase of 34% when comparing third quarter of 2021 to second quarter of 2021, and a 10% increase when compared to the third quarter of 2020. Observations are up 72% when comparing third quarter 2021 to the previous quarter.
- 9. Underage Buyer No UAB alcohol checks or tobacco checks were completed this quarter.
- 10. **Training and Community Outreach** ABC presented over 634 hours of training to law enforcement, licensees and the general public this quarter. There were 553 hours of training received by ABC agents. These agents also attended over 914 hours of community outreach meetings.
- 11. **Accreditation** Re-accreditation for VA ABC was accomplished on January 9th, 2021. A 2nd reaccreditation Term began on November 1st, 2019 and will end on January 31st, 2023. All 190 standards have completed or in progress proofs for the quarter.

These violations can be punishable by fines, suspension or revocation of the ABC license.

Field Contacts

A field contact is when an agent engages a citizen and conducts a brief interview. When an arrest does not occur as a result of a field interview, agents report the stop in a "Field Contact" report. This report documents the reason for the stop as well as identifying information about the individual. Scrutiny of these types of encounters enables law enforcement executives as well as citizens to monitor police/citizen interactions to guard against biased-based policing practices.

License Activity Totals

A significant amount of an agent's time is committed to the approval process of both retail and "one day" banquet licenses. This process involves background investigations, venue/establishment inspections and training.

Retail License Approvals

Retail Application approvals, sometimes tied to economic conditions, increased 13% for the third quarter of 2021 when compared to the previous quarter. In 3Q of 2020 there were 504 retail license approvals compared to 517 in 3Q of 2021 reflecting a 2% increase in approvals.


Banquet Licenses Approvals

Banquet License approvals, which follow seasonal trends, increased 61% in the third quarter when compared to the previous quarter. In 3Q of 2020 there were 2943 banquet license approvals compared to 4033 in 3Q of 2021 reflecting a 37% increase in activity compared to second quarter of last year.

To this end, this quarter agents presented 634 hours of training to law enforcement, licensees and the general public. There were over 2655 hours of training received by ABC agents. These agents also attended over 914 hours of community outreach meetings.
