Information on Product Placement Requirements Legislation


With a growing variety of alcoholic and non-alcoholic products filling shelves at licensed stores around the commonwealth, a law effective July 1, 2023, strives to ensure consumer safety and avoid confusion by regulating the display of wine and beer and a relatively new category of products known as "crossover products."

The new law requires persons licensed to sell wine and beer and crossover products for off-premises consumption that display such products outside a clearly discernible location reserved for alcoholic beverages to:

- Not place wine or beer products in an area immediately adjacent to non-alcoholic beverages containing the same or similar brand name, logo, or packaging as an alcoholic beverage
- Equip any such display with signage that indicates the product is an alcoholic beverage, is clearly visible to consumers, and is of sufficient size to notify the consumer that the product contains alcohol.
