2024 Do Not Sell Stickers Coming in December

"Do Not Sell" stickers help your business combat sales to underage persons. These easy-to-read tools assist ID checking for alcohol and nicotine product sales.

The 2024 Do Not Sell Stickers will be mailed to licensees in December.

It is extremely important that these stickers be placed where both the seller and buyer can see them, such as on a register or a countertop where purchases are made. The stickers are coated with a smear-resistant varnish in order to prevent fading and damage from cleaning solution spray.

Product Placement Requirements

The new law, which went into effect on July 1, 2023, requires persons licensed to sell wine and beer and crossover products for off-premises consumption that display such products outside a clearly discernible location reserved for alcoholic beverages to:

- Not place wine or beer products in an area immediately adjacent to nonalcoholic beverages containing the same or similar brand name, logo or packaging as an alcoholic beverage.
- Equip any such display with signage that indicates the product is an alcoholic beverage, is clearly visible to consumers and is of sufficient size to notify the consumer that the product contains alcohol.
